

#### Late Students

A number of students continue to arrive late daily. Please make every effort to have your child/ren at school on time for 9:00am. When a child is late he/she misses valuable teaching time. Late arrivals cause disruption to the other students and also to the teacher who has already started the lessons for the day. Developing good work habits and time management skills can maximize a child's learning potential.

# **Dressing For Winter**

Please encourage your children to dress appropriately for the cold winter weather. The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board policy states that consideration should be given for modification recess time spent outdoors when the wind chill reaches –20C. At –25C students will be kept indoors. Also, information was sent home via School Messenger regarding our **Winter Walk** on February 13<sup>th</sup>. Please ensure that your child is prepared to walk outside for 20 minutes on Thursday. This event is an Eco School initiative intended to inspire students to walk to school if possible.

### **Leaving During the School Day**

When it is necessary for your child to leave school early, please send a note to your child's teacher advising him/her of the time that you will be picking your child up. If you are sending someone to pick up your child, please inform the office of this intent. Students will not be released without parental consent.

# **Allergy Alert**

St. Lucy is an "allergen aware school". There are pupils in attendance who suffer from severe and life-threatening allergies to certain foods, such as peanut and nut products and, in some cases, sesame seeds, seafood, and eggs. Exposure to the smallest quantities can cause severe life-threatening reactions. We at St. Lucy would appreciate the cooperation of the entire school community by NOT sending any lunches or snacks that could potentially harm a pupil. Please make sure that all of your children's caregivers are aware of the food restrictions. Students should be reminded not to share food items. No food treats are to be sent to the school for birthdays or special occasions. There are many alternatives such as stickers and pencils. All food treats sent for sharing will be returned for home use.

#### Kiss 'N Ride

To ensure the safety of our students, parents/guardians are asked to adhere to the following drop-off/pick-up rules:

- 1. Parents/Guardians who are dropping off/picking up students, or those requiring assistance, please park in a designated parking spot and walk your child to the designated area in the school yard.
- 2. Students who do not require assistance can be dropped off/picked up in the Kiss 'N Ride area.
- 3. To maintain traffic flow, please leave Kiss 'N Ride area once drop off/pick up is complete.
- 4. Please do not leave your car unattended or idling. There is no parking/stopping in Drive Through Lanes, Bus Lanes, and any area along the fence.
- 5. Please drive carefully and watch for students. Let's work together to keep everyone safe.



# COMMUNITY INFORMATION BULLETIN: Self-Identification Option for Indigenous Families

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) is committed to supporting Indigenous (First Nation, Métis, and Inuit) students and families in our schools.

If you are First Nation (Status or Non-Status Indian), Métis, or Inuit, you are invited to self-identify as Indigenous. No documentation or proof of ancestry is required. Self-identification is voluntary and confidential.

Self-identification will provide access to cultural and language programs, as well as monthly programming for Indigenous students and families. Relevant information will be sent directly to families about upcoming cultural events and opportunities which help foster a sense of community and Indigenous pride within Dufferin-Peel.
